






#### Farewell to the Financial Controller




# **Great News for Alexandra House**

It is inspiring to see our residents interacting so enthusiastically with our new projector, that creates a series of interactive light games specifically designed for people with dementia.



This Plaque was unveiled in honour of Sir Josiah Mason who invested in the copperworks and provided for the children of the area.

He became a partner in the Elkington electroplating business having amassed a fortune in his pen making factory in Birmingham. He then suggested making more affordable everyday items such as jewellery and cutlery.

Josiah was a very generous man, and provided non-denominational education for the children of the workers in the Pembrey Copper Works.

Some parents were suspicious of his motives, so those who were reluctant to send their children to his school he encouraged with gifts of hats, shoes and clothes, and that did the trick!
